❖ Catch a movie or a concert at The Cabot (286 Cabot St) or live theater at The Larcom (13 Wallis St)

❖ Listen to live music at Chianti Jazz Lounge (285 Cabot), Spotlight Tavern (208 Rantoul St) or The Indo Pub (298 Cabot) – they all also have outdoor spaces!

❖ Go candlepin bowling at the Bowl-O-Mat! (100 River St)

❖ Get inspired at one of our amazing galleries and studios which all feature local talent! Mingo Gallery & Custom Framing (284 Cabot), Zeitgeist Studios (222 Cabot), Porter Mill Studios (95 Rantoul St), 301 Gallery (301 Cabot), Montserrat Gallery (32 Essex St)

❖ Skateboard at McPherson Skate Park – complete with half pipes, ramps & more (4 McPherson Dr); there's also a softball field and b-ball court!

❖ Check out the best-known legal graffiti wall in MA! The 500' wall is located behind the Clemenzi Industrial Park at the end of West Dane St and it can be seen from McPherson Drive

❖ Paint your own pottery at Clay Dreaming Pottery Studio (186 Cabot St) or sip some wine while you paint a masterpiece at Wicked Art Bar (95 Rantoul)



❖ Have a blast at one of our community events – Arts Fest, the block parties, Beverly's New Year!

❖ Play football or frisbee, play guitar under a tree or sketch the sky on the historic Beverly Common (intersection of Dane St and Essex St)

❖ Visit the John Cabot House, home of the Beverly Historical Society and Museum, and start of the Privateer Trail, where you can see ancient burial grounds and learn about naval history (117 Cabot St)

❖ Take the train to Boston! The Beverly Depot station has more frequent trains than the other Beverly stops (10 Park St)

❖ Enjoy cocktails and dinner at one of more than 20 restaurants downtown! From casual family spots to specialty menus to award-winning whiskey bars, we have what you want!

❖ Enjoy a latte at Atomic Cafe (268 Cabot), Gusto Café (280 Cabot) or What's Brewin (198 Cabot) – or hit up the Little Coffee Shop food truck down by the Depot train station
